

## **JOINT ENTRANCE EXAM TO COMPUTER SCIENCE/ instructions for examinees**

ENTRANCE EXAM MAY 25 2001 AT 10:00 – 13:00

1) Please make sure that you have been given two (2) exam papers and three (3) pages of appended material, two (2) papers to write your answers on and one scribbling paper

### **2) Answering**

- on **each** paper, please fill in the information required at the top
- at the entrance exam to computer science, **you may answer two (2) problems**
- write the answer to each problem on a separate paper in a clear hand. Illegible text will not be read
- **for each answer, you may use only one double paper**
- if you answer more than two (2) problems, the best answer will be discarded in the evaluation
- the evaluation will be affected by how easily understandable, consequent and fluently written the answers are
- please lift up your hand if you need to speak to the supervisors

### **3) Evaluation**

- the answers are evaluated with whole points, and each problem is worth 25 points. The maximum amount of points in this exam is 50
- the final, specific amount of points deciding admission is separately decided by each university that arranges this joint exam

### **4) Handing in the papers**

- please check that your name and other essential information is on each paper, the empty ones, as well
- check that you have written each answer on a separate paper along with the number of the problem
- make sure that you have answered only two (2) problems
- when you leave the room, please hand in all answer papers to the supervisors, empty ones, as well
- show your ID when handing in the papers
- take the problem papers with you

### **5) Further**

- the results will be published on **June 26 2001**. Each applicant will receive the results by mail.
- the letter will explain procedures for registration at the university and how to demand a correction of the results
- correction demands as regards the computer science joint exam should be sent by July 10 2001, at 16:15, to the following address
